

### The 51 U.S. Supreme Court Justices from 1925 to 2019, Their Terms, Votes on the ACLU/U.S. Supreme Court Cases, and Related Information

(29 or 56.86% of the 51 Justices were nominated by Republican Presidents;  
22 or 43.14% were nominated by Democratic Presidents)

This picturesque chart shows the 51 Justices who opined on the ACLU Supreme Court cases from 1925 to 2019, the time each Justice was on the Court, the number of ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases each voted on, and how many of their votes were for the side the ACLU supported. In addition, the chart shows the percentage of each Justice's votes on the side of the ACLU, the political party of the president nominating each Justice to the Court and which president nominated each Justice to the Court.
