Presidents and the Percentage of Their Justices Voting on the Same Side as the ACLU¹²

This chart shows how the Justices nominated to the Court by each of the 19 presidents voted percentagewise on the side of the ACLU. For example, President William Howard Taft, No. 2. Column A, nominated two Justices to the Court, Charles Evans Hughes and Willis Van Devanter, and those two Justices combined voted on 17 ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases; 13 of those votes, or 76.47%, were on the same side as the ACLU. Warren G, Harding, president No. 4, put four Justices on the Court. Those four Justices collectively voted on 20 ACLU/ U.S. Supreme Court cases. Seven of those votes, or 35%, were on the side the ACLU was on.
