U.S. Presidents and the Percentage of How the Justice(s) They Put on the Court Voted on the Same Side as the ACLU¹⁰

This chart shows how the Justices, nominated by the 19 U.S. presidents, voted percentage-wise on the side of the ACLU and how many ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases they voted on.

For example, Theodore Roosevelt, No. 1 in Column A, nominated one Justice to the court, Oliver Wendell Holmes, Jr. Holmes voted on three ACLU cases. He was on the side of the ACLU in two of those cases or 66.67% of the time.

Warren G. Harding, president No. 4, put four Justices on the Court. Those four Justices collectively voted on 20 ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases. Seven of those votes, or 35%, were on the side the ACLU was on.
