Presidents and the Favorable-Voting Percentage of the Justice(s) They Appointed¹⁰

This chart shows the percentage of each Justice's votes on the side of the ACLU and how many ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases they voted on, stratified by the 19 Presidents who appointed them.

For example, Theodore Roosevelt, No. 1 in Column A, nominated one Justice to the court, Oliver Wendell Holmes, Jr. He voted on three ACLU cases and was on the side of the ACLU in two of those cases, or 66.67% of the time.

Warren G. Harding, President No. 4, put four Justices on the Court. Those four Justices collectively voted on 20 ACLU / U.S. Supreme Court cases. Seven of those votes, or 35%, were on the side the ACLU was on.
